NCFH would like to introduce Jeff Williams, Diversion Director

The Northside Diversion Program is a voluntary "zone-based" pre-arrest/pre-booking program operated by the Northside Coalition for FairHousing in collaboration with Zone 1 of the Pittsburgh Bureau of Police that will target low level/non-violent offenders ages (12-26) who reside and/orcommit an offense in one (1) of the these five (5) targeted publicly subsidized communities:

- Allegheny Commons
- Allegheny Dwellings
- Northside Properties
- Northview Heights
 - Spring Hill

The Northside Diversion Program will serve as an "alternative toprosecution" for eligible participants and provide an opportunity to keep theircase from being forwarded to be formally charged and having to appear incourt. Eligibility for the program will be determined by Zone 1 of thePittsburgh Bureau of Police.
